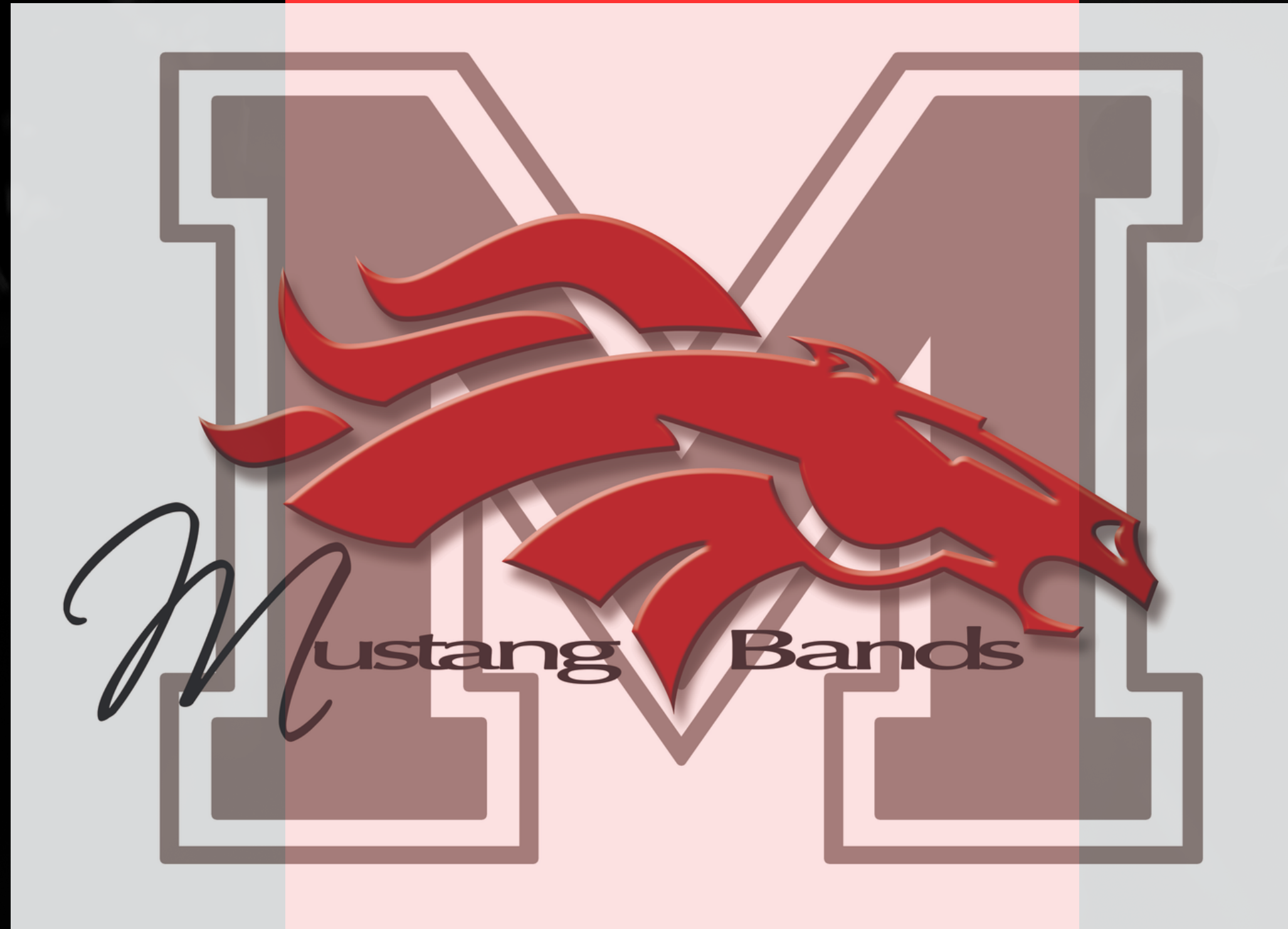

July 2026 Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, July 7th at 6:30 p.m. in the Band Room

CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Mustang Band Boosters was called to order in the MHS band room at 6:34 p.m. on Tuesday, July 7, 2026 by the MHS Band Booster President, Rachel Robins.

OLD BUSINESS

Secretary's Report

Meeting minutes from the June 6th meeting were presented by secretary Melissa Marschall. All booster meeting minutes can be viewed on the band booster website, mustangbandboosters.com. Rachel Robins made a motion to approve the July minutes. Approved by Alexis Thach, seconded by Kate Judd. All in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Kate Judd, treasurer, presented the financial report as of June 30 and noted a few reporting errors within QuickBooks, including the taxes line, are being corrected. The current checking account balance is \$60,706.29, and the financial reports reflect the start of the new fiscal year beginning June 1, including the first show-related expenses. All financials can be reviewed on the band booster website mustangbandboosters.com and that any questions may be directed to the Treasurer or finance team.

Fireworks sales totaled approximately \$67,000 before taxes and we will have additional revenue from the Good Guys location.

The Fan Pledge fundraiser has already raised more than \$40,000, putting the

program well ahead of last year's fundraising pace and making strong progress toward the \$100,000 goal.

A motion to approve the financials was made by President, Rachel Robins. Approved by Shanelle Maxwell and seconded by Tarresa Cosson. All in favor, none opposed, motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

New in-person payment option

Angie Mills introduced a new in-person debit and credit card payment option that allows families to make payments without paying online convenience fees. The payment system will be available during uniform fittings and other Booster events. Parents were asked to use the provided payment envelopes, include both their student's name and student ID number on all payments, and ensure envelopes are sealed before submission. Angie also reminded parents to include their student's name or ID number on the memo line of any checks received through fundraising efforts such as the 30 for 30 campaign. Parents were encouraged to contact her at any time with questions regarding account balances or student credits.

Fireworks

Booster leadership celebrated the success of the annual fireworks fundraiser and expressed appreciation to the many volunteers and students who worked throughout the week. Despite severe weather on the final evening, students demonstrated exceptional teamwork and commitment. A final workday will be scheduled to inventory and organize the remaining fireworks before closing out the fundraiser for the year.

Rachel Robins also recognized the students and parents who participated in the city fireworks cleanup. Students completed not only their assigned cleanup area but also an additional section.

Coordinator Positions

Several coordinator updates were announced during the meeting. Chad Nash has volunteered to serve as the new Fireworks Coordinator. Natalie Gordon is the new Chaperon Coordinator. In addition, the Boosters are launching a Photography Team led by Michael and Heidi Watts. The goal of the new team is to provide comprehensive photo coverage of band activities throughout the year and make those images available to families at no cost. Additional volunteers are welcome, and more information about the photography program will be shared at an upcoming meeting.

The Booster organization continues to seek volunteers for several open coordinator positions, including Camp Crew Coordinator and Hydration Coordinator. Members were encouraged to consider volunteering

individually or as co-coordinators and reminded that experienced volunteers are available to provide guidance and support.

Uniform Fittings

Uniform fitting information was provided by the coordinator, Christina Tonay. Sign-ups opened immediately following the meeting. Returning marchers should bring their marching shoes, compression gear, and socks, while new marchers will be fitted for all required uniform items. Student and parent volunteers are needed throughout the fitting process. Section jacket fittings will also occur during the fitting week.

Tri-M

Information was shared regarding the Tri-M Music Honor Society. Parents were encouraged to remind eligible students to apply once applications become available after school begins. Students participating in Tri-M will complete volunteer service hours, and Booster activities provide many opportunities to fulfill those requirements.

PRESIDENT’S REPORT

President Rachel Robins thanked all parents, students, and volunteers for their dedication throughout the summer, particularly during the fireworks fundraiser and cleanup efforts. Members were encouraged to continue supporting the program by volunteering, attending upcoming events, and helping create another successful marching season. Many hands make light work.

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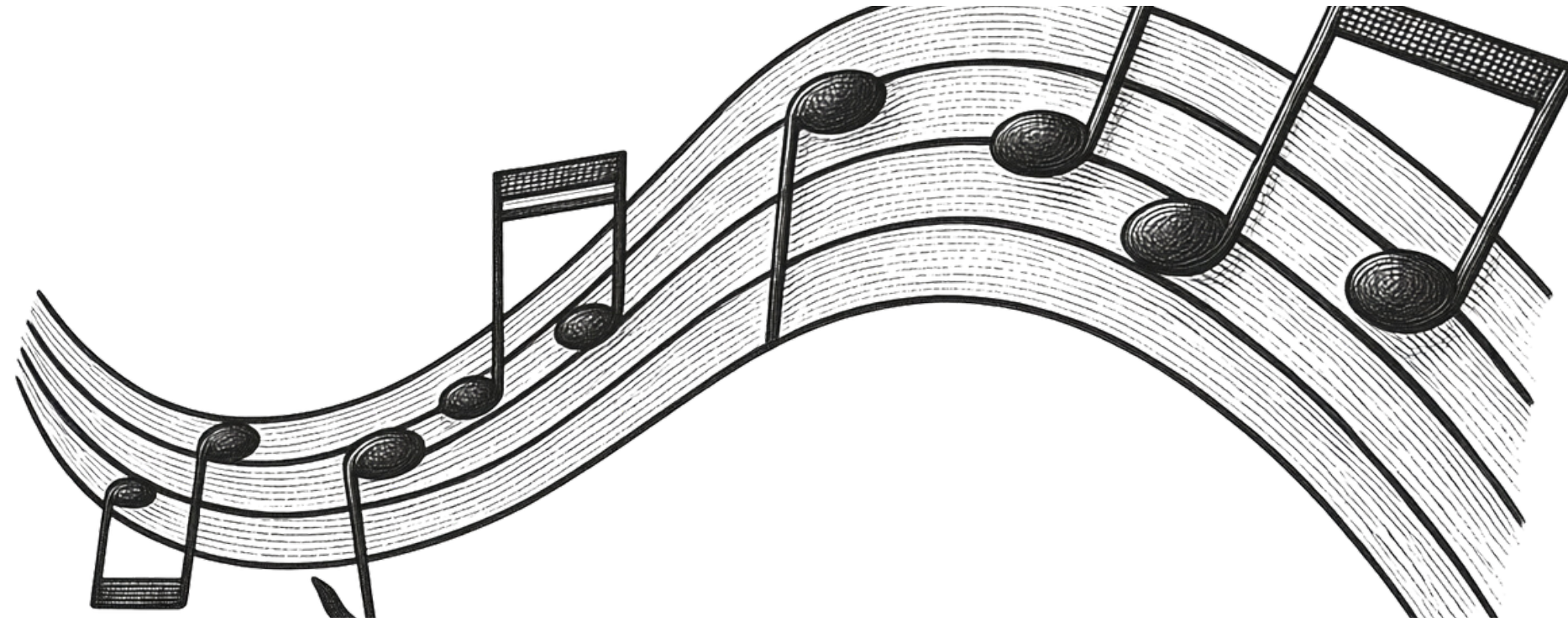
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Booster By-Law Updates



The Mustang Band Booster bylaws were amended and successfully approved in the spring of 2026. Here are a few highlights that are changes members need to be aware of in regards to attendance at monthly booster meetings.

Member Voting Rights

Article II Membership; Section 1. Eligibility

Membership shall be open to parents/guardians of students active in any Mustang High School band program.

Member Voting Rights

Article II Membership; Section 3. Voting Rights

Each member in good standing is entitled to one vote on matters presented to the membership. A member in good standing shall be defined as a member who has current dues paid in full, complies with the organization's bylaws and the school district's code of conduct, has not had their membership rights suspended or revoked by the Executive Board, and has attended at least two booster meetings per semester.

Officers

Article III Officers; Section 2. Eligibility, Terms, Transition, and Term Limits

Booster Membership Requirement

To be eligible to serve as an officer or board member, an individual must be a current member in good standing of the Booster Club and must maintain active membership throughout their term. If the executive member's student(s) are no longer active in any of the MHS Band Programs, the executive member must vacate their position. A replacement shall be elected at the following booster meeting. To be eligible to be elected as a booster officer, a member must have been in good standing the previous year.

Monthly Meetings

Article VII Meetings; Section 1. Regular Meetings

Regular membership meetings shall be held in-person monthly, with a minimum of nine (9) meetings per year. Regularly scheduled meetings are on the first Tuesday of the month at 6:30 PM in the band room. Meetings may be cancelled, rescheduled, or moved to a virtual format at the discretion of the executive board.

Monthly in-person board meetings will be streamed for informational purposes only. Participating in the streamed meeting does not count as attending the meeting.

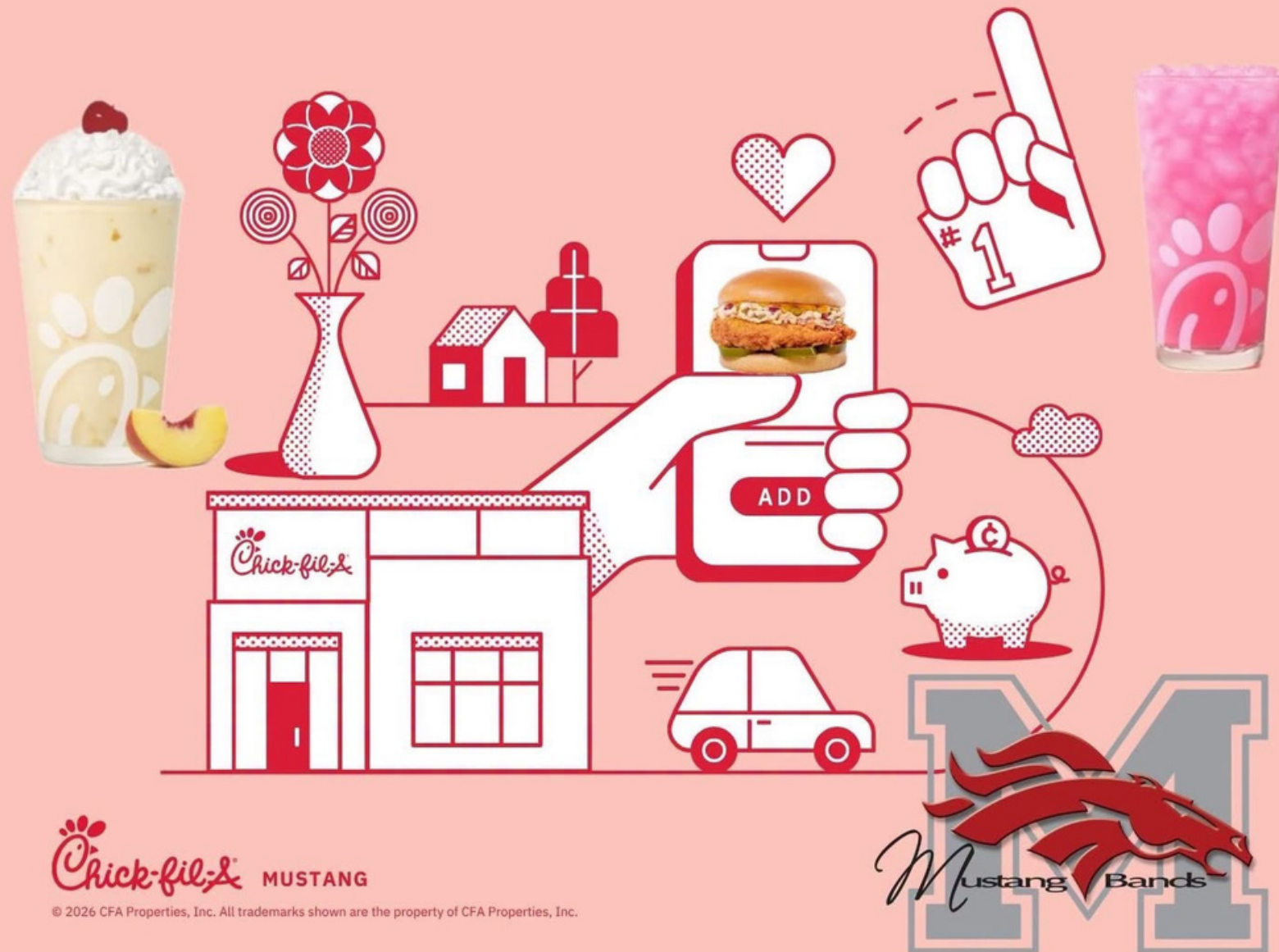
