OLD BUSINESS

Secretary's Report

Meeting minutes from the May 6 meeting were presented by secretary Melissa Marschall. All booster meeting minutes can be viewed on the band booster website, mustangbandboosters.com. Rachel Robins made a motion to approve the June minutes. Approved by Rachel Bankston, seconded by Christina Tonay. All in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Kate Judd, treasurer, reviewed the current financial report and explained that this is the time of year when expenses begin increasing as preparations are made for the upcoming marching season. She noted that although the current account balance is lower than previous months, recent deposits, including approximately \$21,000 from show fees, had not yet been reflected

in the printed report. All financials can be reviewed on the band booster website mustangbandboosters.com. Kate highlighted the organization's primary revenue sources from the previous year, emphasizing the importance of volunteer participation. Fireworks sales generated more than \$71,000, concessions exceeded \$182,000, the Mustang Marching Invitational (MMI) generated more than \$50,000 in a single day, and hosting WGPO brought in more than \$30,000. Additional fundraising efforts, including mattress sales, 30 for 30, donations, and other fundraisers, also contribute significantly to the band's financial success.

motion to approve the financials was made by Rachel Robins. Approved by Jessica Jones and seconded by Shanelle Maxwell. All in favor, none opposed, motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

Coordenator Updates and Needs

Needs for the 2026 coordinator positions were announced as well as gratitude for those that have volunteered their time to fill previously open positions. Jessica Jones will be the new medical coordinator. Kristen Richter will be the social media coordinator.

The camp crew, hydration, and fireworks coordinators are still needing to be filled.

Hydration Coordinator

Erin Brockwell provided an overview of the Hydration Coordinator role and encouraged volunteers to consider serving in the position as she and her husband, Shawn, prepare to transition out of the role. The Hydration Coordinator is responsible for ensuring students have access to clean, filtered drinking water during football games, competitions, camps, and other band events. Responsibilities include maintaining and transporting the band's custom-built hydration system, locating water sources at event sites, setting up and refilling water stations throughout the day, and performing routine maintenance on the equipment. Erin emphasized that providing reliable access to clean drinking water helps keep students healthy, hydrated, and performing at their best while reducing the need for bottled water. Volunteers interested in the position, particularly those comfortable maintaining the equipment, were encouraged to contact the booster board.

Camp Crew Coordinator

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Erin Brockwell also explained the responsibilities of the Camp Crew Coordinator. Camp Crew is responsible for transporting, setting up, and taking down the band's central camp area at competitions and other events. This includes canopies, tents, tables, uniform changing areas, guard stations, hydration stations, and other equipment needed throughout the day. Camp serves as the band's home base where students prepare for performances, change uniforms, eat meals, hydrate, and return after performances. Camp

Crew arrives before the students to ensure everything is ready upon arrival and remains after the event to break down and pack all equipment. Erin encouraged volunteers to consider the position and shared that she and her husband are willing to train and mentor anyone interested in taking over the role.

Fireworks 2026

Robin Glinsmann, firework coordinator, a.k.a. the queen of fireworks, provided an overview of the annual fireworks fundraiser, one of the band's largest fundraising events. Sales will take place June 27 through July 4 at the Curtis Park location, with extended sales hours approved by the City of Mustang. Robinn reviewed volunteer expectations, booth setup and teardown, daily inventory management, safety procedures, cleanup requirements, and student participation. She announced that the booster organization will add a second booth location this year in partnership with Clear Springs Church and shared plans to transition to a new fireworks vendor next year, which will simplify operations and provide upgraded facilities and sales technology. Volunteers were encouraged to sign up for shifts, and Robinn emphasized the importance of parent support in ensuring the fundraiser's continued success.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Rachel Robins introduced herself as the incoming Band Booster President and welcomed new families to the organization. She thanked members for their willingness to volunteer and emphasized the importance of family involvement in supporting the band program.

Rachel recognized the volunteers who worked the Mustang High School graduation concessions and thanked them for their flexibility and hard work. Graduation attendance exceeded expectations, with more than 15,000 attendees, resulting in concession sales that surpassed projections and sold out of several items. She shared that graduation will continue to be held at the football stadium and that lessons learned from this year's event will help improve planning and staffing for future graduations. Rachel noted that the event was a successful fundraiser for the booster organization and expressed appreciation to everyone who contributed to its success.

Rachel reminded members to complete the Secure Volunteer process before participating in activities involving students. She also encouraged families to join the Band App, which serves as the primary communication platform for the booster organization.

Rachel reviewed upcoming events and volunteer opportunities for the summer, including prop build days, mini camps, fireworks sales, uniform fittings, and band camp. She encouraged members to volunteer for prop builds to help ensure students have adequate time to rehearse with show

equipment before competitions. She also reminded parents of the importance of discussing appropriate behavior and social media use with students during camps and off-campus activities.

Rachel shared that parent section chats are available through the Band App to help families connect and communicate throughout the season. She announced that the August booster meeting will include a "Laugh and Learn" volunteer fair, providing members an opportunity to learn more about coordinator positions and volunteer opportunities.

Rachel noted that the directors' appreciation meal will be held during band camp and thanked members in advance for supporting the directors during the busy start of the school year. She also shared that Mr. Edgmon is currently traveling in Europe with an Oklahoma student group and had no additional updates to report.
